The Ladies of Flowers were from 'Cleerly Women', and the St Cleer Gardening Club, and they threw wreaths of herbs onto the pyre to cleanse the community of sin and the fire was lit by Cllr Jane Pascoe, Deputy Mayor of Liskeard and the Liskeard Chamber of Commerce. The evening concluded with tea and saffron buns all around. and the singing of Trelawny. Musical Entertainment was provided by Roger Bennett and Viv, from Looe OCS.
